- as for the Master's degree Admissions - except for the minimum graduation mark of the Bachelor's, which must be at least 93/110 (2.5 CGPA).

- Motivation letter
- Other certificates (conference attendance, foreign language certificates etc).

Selection criteria

“The parties will select the students on the basis of the relevance and quality of their academic background.”

1. Weighted average of marks of the exams passed during the Bachelor's degree (or CGPA for foreign qualification) before the Call deadline: up to 20 points;
2. interview: up to 20 points;
3. CV, motivation letter and other qualifications: up to 10 points.

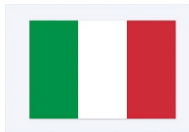

- teaching topics: historical linguistics, area linguistics, experimental methods (statistics, computational linguistics, etc.).

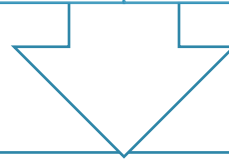
Final thesis and awarding of the degree

Info concerning the Erasmus+ scholarship

- DD scholarship amounts to 800-1000 euros (depending on the country of origin and income).
- The DD scholarship is for 12 months.
- You cannot apply for the DD scholarship and standard Erasmus+ scholarship: if you apply for the DD selection call, you'll have the final list of admitted students by the 10th of Feb. Then you'll know whether to apply for the DD Erasmus+ scholarship or the standard Erasmus+ scholarship.
- On the application form: only DD (UniVR-Konstanz) preference. No other preference.
- If someone withdraws from the DD, the Erasmus+ grant is not reallocated to the others in the ranking list.
- DD is not compatible with the Erasmus+ traineeship, but you can apply for a traineeship (stage) in Konstanz. The traineeship can in principle be managed by the UniVR internship unit.

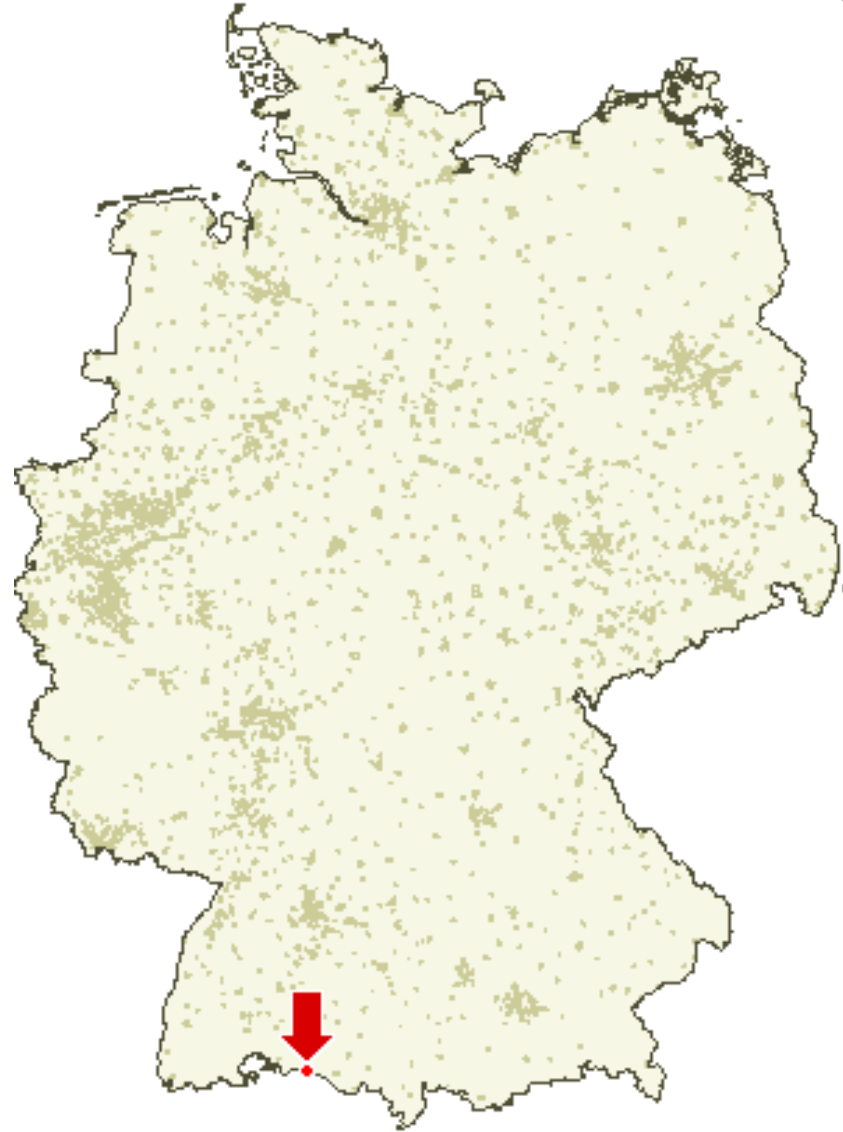

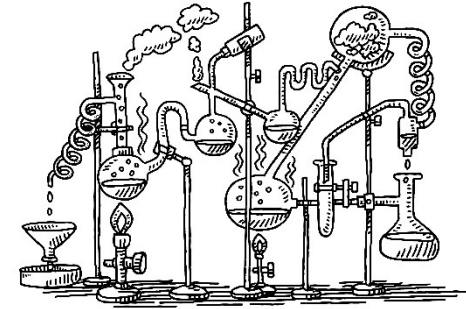
- an **interdisciplinary** approach to research, manifested in a **campus university**,



Degree structure in the Faculty of Humanities

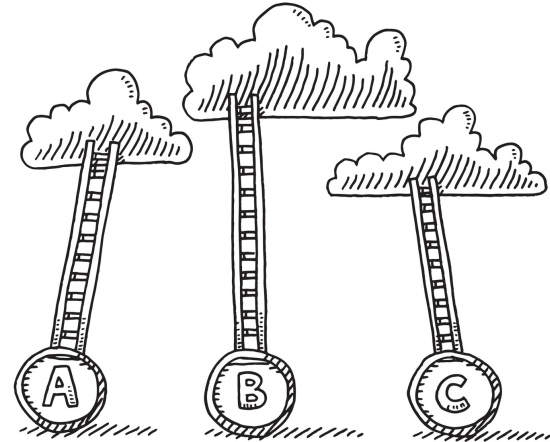
Bachelor level

- usually major and minor (B.Ed. major plus major), incorporating an internship of 8 weeks, transferable and language skills
- compulsory coursework in Year 1, Years 2 and 3 characterized by individual choice = optional courses in modules* of the degrees

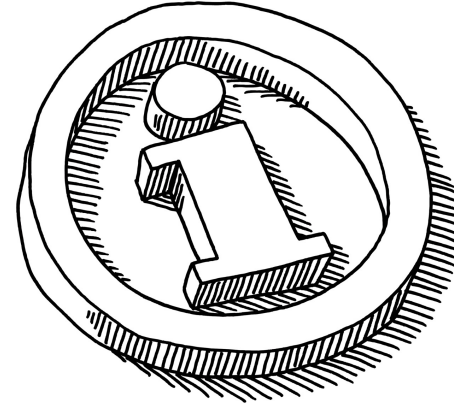
Master level

- usually major (M.Ed. major plus major), incorporating transferable and language skills
- compulsory coursework in Year/Semester 1, Year 2 characterized by individual choice = optional courses in modules* of the degrees

* in German “Modul” ≠ module



Important terms and academic structures

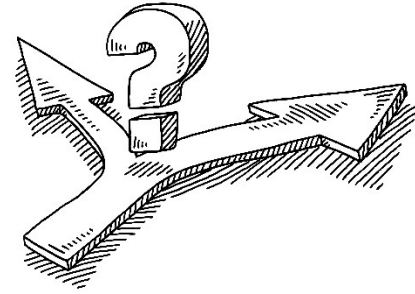


We use the term „**course**“ generically while the types of courses on offer vary from department to department. Terms you will come across in almost every department include:

- *lecture*
- *seminar* (introductory / advanced)
- *course*

When looking into our course catalogue, you will also come across the term „**module**“. This, however, **refers to a larger entity / group of courses from a certain subject area / XYZ and NOT to an individual course**. In ZEuS you would have to look through the offer within a module and select an item from a list of possible choices.

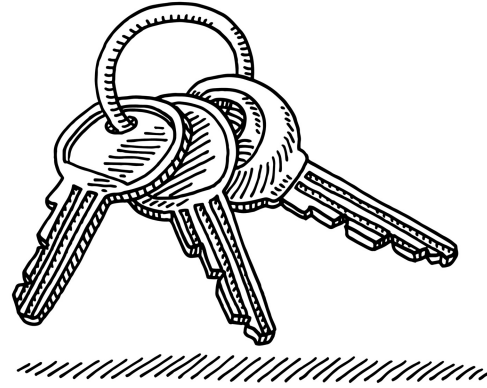
The academic year



Semester system: winter and summer semester

- **Winter**: mid/end of **October** until mid/end of **February** (lecture/teaching period)
 - exams usually in the last week of the teaching period
 - followed by a lecture-free period until mid-April
- **Summer**: mid/end of **April** until mid/end of **July** (lecture/teaching period)
 - exams usually in the last week of the teaching period
 - followed by a lecture-free period until mid-October
- **Semesters are independent entities**, courses usually run for one semester only.
- **Course catalogue** (named “**ZEuS**”) updated every semester, reflecting the research interests of the academic staff, available in
 - ✧ **late February** for the following **summer** semester (starting in mid-April) and in
 - ✧ **late July** for the following **winter** semester (starting in mid-October)

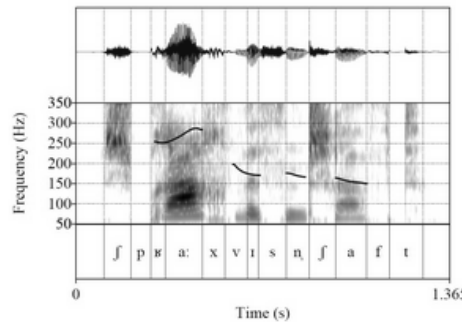

In courses students are expected to **participate actively**, i.e. take part in the discussions, present their opinions etc. Therefore one of the overall number of achievable credits is awarded for attendance and participation in class. This entails that missing too many sessions (unexcused) will mean that a student cannot complete a course successfully.

Modul 6 ADDITIONAL CLASSES

Related disciplines and foreign language classes

This module is supposed to foster interdisciplinarity and additional skills, the students can choose classes, e.g., in political sciences, psychology, sociology or additional classes in linguistics as well as language classes.

MA examination (24 ECTS): This consists of the thesis (18 ECTS), participation in a colloquium (18 ECTS) as well as an oral exam (3 ECTS)

Differences between Konstanz and Verona

- The Konstanz MA is organized in **Modules**
- Each **module** consists of one or more courses (we call them **seminars** or **colloquia**). For most courses, students can get **6-9 ECTS** (language classes can also have only 3 ECTS)
- The variety of courses that can be taken within a module, varies from one semester to another. For example, within the Module APPLIED LINGUISTICS, there can be classes on third language acquisition or child bilingualism, or language policy.
- Most of the classes that Verona students will take are offered as one of the tracks in the MA Linguistics
